KDO Grants Report Cathy Boerke (2023-2024 Mission Chair)

It has been another year of breaking records and the most competitive year yet, with a total of 37 applications for the **2024 KDO Traditional Grants**. That is a 10% increase over last year. Additionally, we received the highest monetary ask to date of \$542,000, which is nearly \$100,000 more than what was requested last year. It seems that our organization is no longer the "best-kept secret," as we have gained more visibility and attention from our audience. However, it was a challenging task for the committee members to figure out how to reduce the financial amount from the submissions to the allocated \$185,000.

Fortunately, our committee was comprised of some of the most dynamic, diverse, and perceptive minds to evaluate which applicants BEST suited the needs of our seniors in **Sangamon County**. This committee was not only able to dissect and evaluate how each application would make the most impact, but they also did it swiftly and with great intent.

The committee members were in for a surprise as lightning was about to strike for a second time. Last year, the first strike was from a one-time pass-through of \$50,000 increasing the **Traditional Grant** allocation to \$225,000. This year, due to the unique circumstances that have been accumulating since COVID and the success of last year's **Luncheon and Style Show**, that one-time pass-through struck again raising this year's allocation to **\$230,000**. We have been extremely fortunate to exceed all expectations over these past two years.

This year's **Traditional Grants** were awarded to 19 agencies (21 grants) that are clearly dedicated to the well-being of seniors. These agencies are the front line of people who bring solutions to the many obstacles that seniors face. Our organization has once again had the great privilege of helping them make that happen.

Our most recent **Blackstock Grant** recipient has also been making a significant impact on our community. We have allotted an additional \$30,000 this year for **Senior Services of Central Illinois** to continue with bed bug eradication. Their services have expanded from treating tenant's residences to now including homeowners.

Between the **Traditional** and **Blackstock Grants**, we are awarding an unprecedented **\$260,000**. It has been inspiring to see how both committees came together to make a difference through philanthropy, helping seniors avoid hunger, displacement, and meeting their medical needs. I would like to recognize and thank all the members of both committees.

What is a Mizpah? (pronounced MIZ pah)

"The Lord watch between me and thee while we are absent one from the other."

A tradition, carried over from the time when **King's Daughters** was first brought to **Springfield** as a Christian organization, is the closing of meetings by members holding hands and reciting the **Mizpah**. In this context, it is a promise, covenant, a sacred agreement.

Origin: It is an agreement between two people that requires more solemnity than a human promise. The implications is that God is the witness ("The Lord watch between me and thee"). A pillar or heap of stones is built to stand as a permanent symbol of the commitment each party makes. The two parties are going separate ways ("while we are absent, one from the other") and won't see each other again for a very long time or ever, therefore will not be able to hold each other accountable and are depending on God to endorse their agreement . -- Genesis 31:43-54

Other meanings: Watchtower, or lookout tower. A heap of stones signifying a pillar or tower.

While **KDO** is no longer classified as a Christian organization and welcomes those of all faiths, the use of the **Mizpah** continues as a parting wish and blessing passed from member to member to show care and camaraderie.

### Volunteerism

**Opening Minds through Art** (OMA) is an award-winning, evidence-based intergenerational art-making program for people with dementia, developed at **Miami University in Ohio** in 2007. People living with dementia are paired with volunteers, who assist them in learning to rely on imagination instead of memory, and focus on remaining skills instead of lost skills, while building genuine friendships with the volunteers as they engage in the art-making. OMA enables people living with dementia to assume new roles as artists leaving a legacy of beautiful artwork.

The Kings Daughters Organization, utilizing the Blackstock Fund, sponsored the Springfield Art Association's OMA project from 2017 to 2019. Judy Rader (FR) was one of the KDO members who served as a volunteer. This year when she was notified that the Art Association was beginning a new OMA Program (funded by a grant from the St. Joseph Home Legacy of Care Fund at CFLL), she quickly volunteered again.

These beautiful works of art were on display at a reception honoring the students held at **Springfield Art Association**, on May 31, 2024.
